RAYMOND W. KELLY '63 STUDENT COMMONS

Open since 2014, the Kelly Student Commons links the north and south parts of campus. A true community space, the building significantly enhances the College's ability to integrate academics and student programming. It provides space for fitness and wellness programming, dining, study, and cultural and community events.

Bookstore

The Manhattan College bookstore is located in the Kelly Commons on the second floor. The bookstore will be open between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Stop by for a 10% off coupon, compliments of Barnes & Noble.

Multicultural Center

Located on the third floor of the Kelly Commons, the Multicultural Center provides a space for all identities to thrive and share. The center will be open noon – 4 p.m.

Fitness Center

The 5,215-square-foot Fitness Center is located on the third floor of the student commons. It will be open for viewing 9 a.m. - 4 p.m.

Lasallian Women and Gender Resource Center

Opened in the fall of 2018, the LWGRC is an inclusive space designed to centralize resources and provide support and advocacy for students having experiences related to gender and sexuality.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Academic Scholarships for First-Year Students

Non-need-based scholarships are awarded to extraordinary applicants. Eligibility is based on a variety of accomplishments, such as exceptional SAT or ACT scores, grade-point average, volunteer and community involvement, extracurricular accomplishments and class rank. Students are automatically considered for these scholarships after they have been accepted. Students are eligible for the scholarship for four years of undergraduate study, as long as the student maintains a 3.0 grade point average or higher while in attendance at Manhattan College (unless otherwise stated).

Presidential Scholarships

Presidential Scholarships are awarded to highly qualified students in the top 15% of the Manhattan College applicant pool. As a Presidential Scholar, you are invited to join the Honors Enrichment Program.

Dean's Awards

Dean's Awards are granted to those in the top 25% of the Manhattan College applicant pool who have outstanding extracurricular accomplishments throughout high school.

Chancellor's Awards

Chancellor's Awards will be awarded at the discretion of the scholarship committee. These are awarded to students with high academic performance, leadership ability and extracurricular involvement.

Provost Awards

The College sets aside a limited amount of funds for students who demonstrate strong academic promise, leadership skills, outstanding community service, a special talent, or other personal strengths and accomplishments. These awards are granted for achievement, not financial need. Recipients are selected by the admission committee.

Special Talent Awards

Special Talent Awards are scholarships offered to students who have demonstrated exceptional talents and/or leadership in their high school or community. During the spring, all accepted students will be provided information regarding the awards and the application process.

Athletic Scholarships

For students recruited to participate on one of Manhattan College's Division I athletic teams, there is the possibility of an athletic scholarship.

- These students must be deemed admissible by our traditional academic standards.
- Athletic scholarships and their amounts are determined exclusively by the Athletics department.
- These scholarships are renewable, subject to a student remaining academically eligible, and in accordance with specific conditions determined by the Athletics department.

COMMUNITY

The Arches

The Arches program is a learning and living community for first-year students who are interested in integrating academics with learning experiences outside of the classroom. Students live together in a residence hall and take one class each semester of their freshmen year that is specifically designed for the Arches program. The class incorporates cultural excursions and service projects. In addition, special events and activities are offered to Arches students so they can bond, develop a sense of community, and most importantly, create lasting friendships with peers, faculty and coordinators.

The Arches program gives students a richer and more fulfilling first-year experience. If you are interested in being part of a strong community, exploring New York City and its multicultural richness, want to make a difference, and you have the desire to develop strong bonds with your professors and classmates, then this is the program for you.

Lasallian Heritage

We are a Lasallian educational institution founded in 1853 by the De La Salle Christian Brothers, a Catholic religious teaching order started by John Baptist de La Salle. Known as the patron saint of teachers, De La Salle gave up a life of privilege to educate disadvantaged children in 17th-century France. Manhattan College adheres to the core Lasallian principles: respect for all people, concern for the poor, inclusive community, quality education and faith in the presence of God.

What is a Jasper?

Our unique team name comes from Brother Jasper of Mary, FSC, who served as the prefect of discipline in the 19th century. Br. Jasper brought the then little-known sport of baseball to Manhattan College, served as the team's first coach and is credited in the Baseball Hall of Fame for creating the 7th inning stretch.
